CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Mayor Qourzal called the meeting to order at 6:37 p.m.

ITEMS FOR INDIVIDUAL DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND/OR ACTION

1. DISCUSSION AND CONSIDER ACTION ON ACCEPTANCE OF THE APPLICATION TO DEVELOP IN A PLANNED DISTRICT (MEDICAL OFFICE) LOT 2, BLOCK N, BADGER RANCH ADDITION, PHASE 2 TO THE CITY OF WOODWAY, MCLENNAN COUNTY, TEXAS, LOCATED IN 16401 BADGER RANCH BLVD.

Mayor Qourzal called for a motion to discuss. Councilmember Russell moved to open this item for discussion and Councilmember Avant seconded.

Dr. Oubre provided that this item is only for the Application to Develop and that it is scheduled to go to the P&Z Commission tomorrow and then will come back to Council in January.

Councilmember Cook moved to acceptance of the Application to Develop in a Planned District (medical office) Lot 2, Block N, Badger Ranch Addition, Phase 2 to the City of Woodway, McLennan County, Texas, located in 16401 Badger Ranch Blvd. as recommended by staff, Councilmember Williams seconded, and the motion passed with a six to one vote with Mayor Pro Tem Mercer voting against the application.

2. DISCUSSION AND CONSIDER ACTION ON ADOPTING ORDINANCE 22-10 AMENDING CHAPTER 17, SUBDIVISIONS; OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF WOODWAY, TEXAS, SECTION 17-7, PRELIMINARY PLATS-SUBMISSION, SECTION 17-10, INFORMATION REQUIRED ON ALL FINAL PLATS AND SECTION 17-24, ESCARPMENT ZONE AND GEOLOGICALLY SENSITIVE AREA REGULATIONS

Mayor Qourzal called for a motion to discuss. Councilmember Williams moved to open this item for discussion and Councilmember Cook seconded.

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Dr. Oubre provided comments regarding the work that Staff, Ordinance Committee, and City Attorney have done to amend the language of this ordinance. He commented that there are three main issues that were addressed during this process: Site Testing Permit, Escarpment Report, and Clearing. He also stated that if this Ordinance is adopted that it will apply only to projects moving forward not retroactively.

Councilmember Williams and Councilmember Cook both expressed gratitude to Staff and Dr. Oubre for the work that has been done. Councilmember Russell asked to clarify that the Ordinance will only affect future development and not current development. Dr. Oubre confirmed that was correct.

Dr. Oubre thanked Mr. Langerman with Langerman and Foster Engineering for assisting with this project.

Mayor Qourzal asked if there was anyone who would like to speak on this item. Lori Whitsell of 431 Woodfall Drive expressed her gratitude for the amendment of the Ordinance.

Councilmember Gilman moved to adopt Ordinance 22-10 amending Chapter 17, Subdivisions; of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Woodway, Texas, Section 17-7, Preliminary Plats- Submission, Section 17-10, Information Required on all Final Plats and Section 17-24, Escarpment Zone and Geologically Sensitive Area Regulations. Councilmember Cook seconded, and the motion passed with a six to one vote with Mayor Pro Tem Mercer voting against the Ordinance adoption.
